
Ladies & their Trikes

(My opinion) MAYBE it was because of the expensive but good food.
















































































Keep on Dancin

At last month's gathering, we had a short discussion about helmets and helmet retention standards. Please open this link and give yourself a valuable education concerning motorcycle helmets. Note that the article discusses the standard varieties of helmets and retention systems. BOTTOM LINE: a full face helmet with a Double D Ring fastening system is universally considered by most safety experts to be the SAFEST and MOST SECURE. Quick release ratcheting chin straps, especially those with plastic components have shown a high percentage of helmet ejection in high impact accidents. Half or three quarter helmets provide zero protection for the face and ears. Certainly, this article can get a bit technical and somewhat dry, but please read it thoroughly for your own benefit and education. REMEMBER, ALL THE GEAR ALL THE TIME! Vin
